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## Jagadguru Sri Abhinava Vidyatheertha

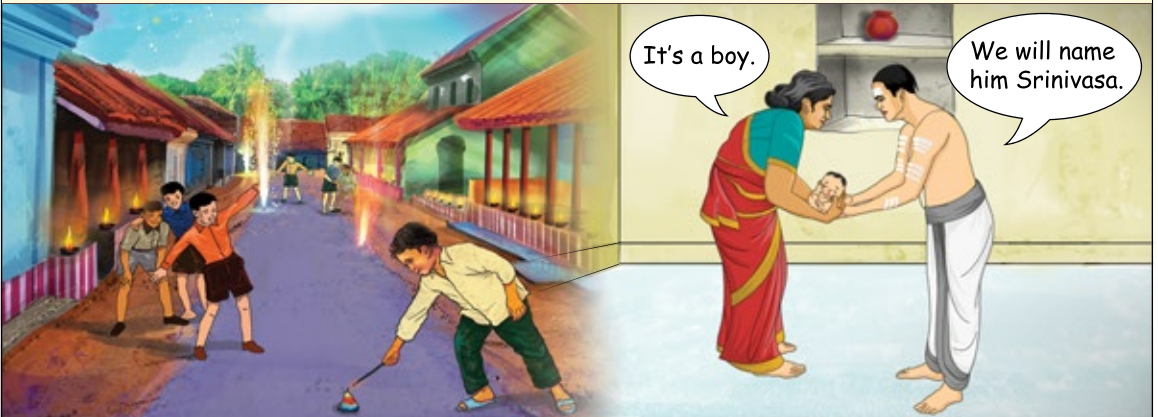

Not only was he a bright student, he readily spared time for other students who approached him for help with their studies.

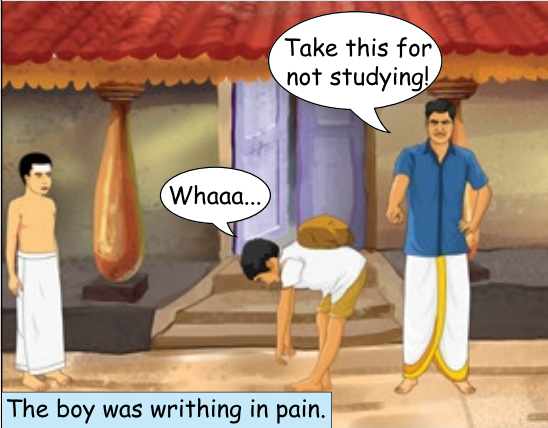
At home too, Srinivasa was a considerate and helpful child.

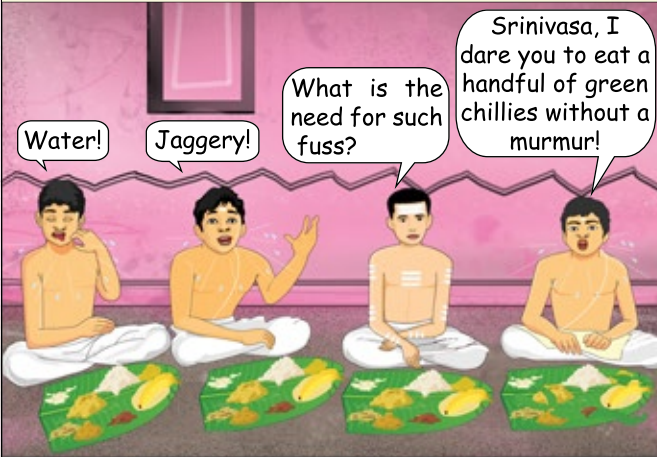
Once, Srinivasa heard piteous cries from outside a neighbouring house.



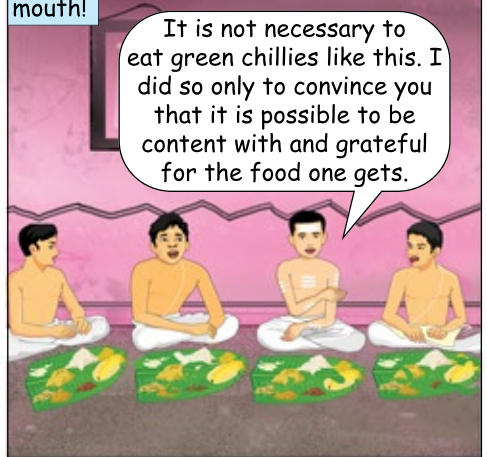
Srinivasa was always ready to put up with suffering for the sake of others.



One day Srinivasa and his friends unintentionally consumed a very pungent dish served to them at a house.



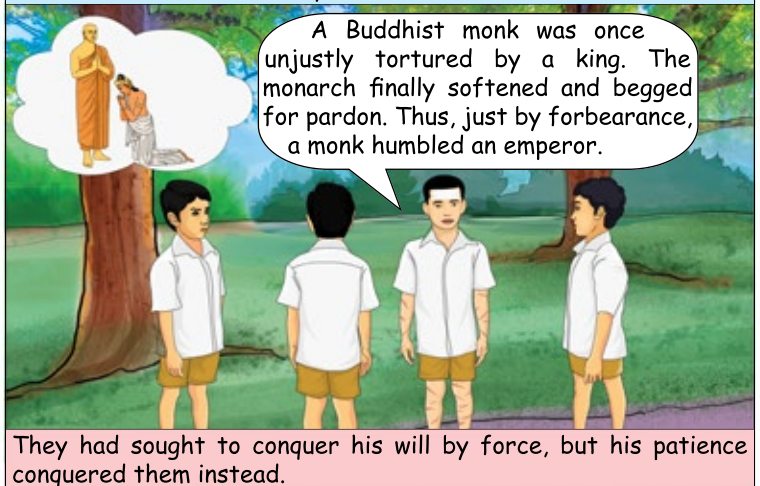
Srinivasa calmly took the challenge. One by one the chillies disappeared into his mouth!



Srinivasa was ever patient. One day, his friends decided to test the limits of his forbearance.



When the boys finally stopped the frenzied beating, they were aghast at the injury they had caused. However, even in that situation, Srinivasa had only kind words for them.



Once a boy was tearing out the wings of butterflies and throwing the hapless creatures to a dog.



Srinivasa quickly grasped his hands and twisted them.



He was personally forbearing and also not given to hurting others. Yet, his courage and wisdom made him take steps appropriate to the circumstances, to prevent people from causing harm to others.

There was a pond nearby that no one would approach after sunset, as it was believed to be infested with ghosts. Even as a child, Srinivasa had no such fears.



On being challenged by his friends, he boldly ran to the tank on a new moon night, washed his hands and feet and returned.

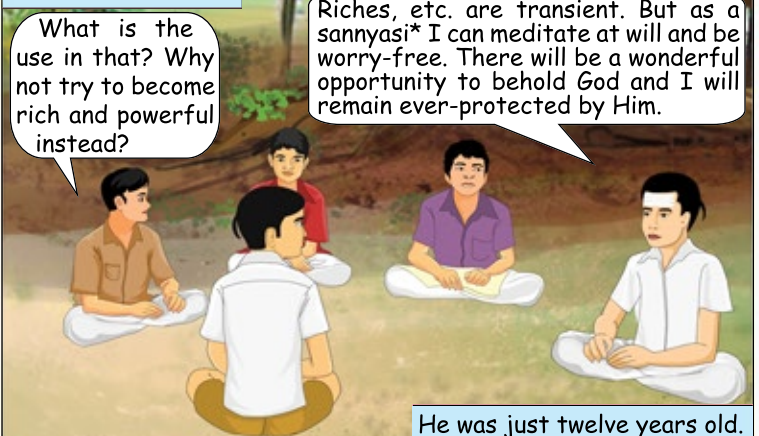


Such was Srinivasa's unshakeable faith in God even as a child.

He had a small crystal idol of Lord Ganesha, to which he unflinching offered simple, earnest worship every day.



He started to regularly express to his friends that he wished to renounce the world.



He was just twelve years old.

One day, mistakenly assuming that his son was not studying properly, Rama Shastri was about to punish him. While intervening, a tenant who was an astrologer, chanced to see the child's palm.



The astrologer introduced them to the agent of the Sringeri Math\*, who in turn arranged for Srinivasa's sacred thread ceremony at Sringeri<sup>#</sup>. It was May 1930.



The family then paid their respects to Jagadguru<sup>®</sup> Sri Chandrashekhara Bharathi, then pontiff of the Sringeri Sharada Peetham<sup>‡</sup>.



The wise answer of the twelve-year-old impressed the great sage.

With the permission of the Jagadguru, Srinivasa stayed back at Sringeri to study Sanskrit and the scriptures.



He kept up an orderly schedule and sincerely engaged himself in studies.

His lofty qualities such as deep devotion, firm dispassion, innate longing for renunciation, forbearance, compassion and intellectual brilliance made Srinivasa the Jagadguru's natural choice to succeed him to the great Peetham.



The thirteen-year-old celibate was initiated into Paramahansa Sannyasa\*\* on 22<sup>nd</sup> May, 1931. He was given a new name on that day by his Guru, and hence came to be known thereafter as His Holiness Jagadguru Sri Abhinava Vidyatheertha.

His Holiness practiced severe austerity. While others struggled to cope with the very cold Sringeri winters, he would wear wet clothes and sleep on the bare floor at night.



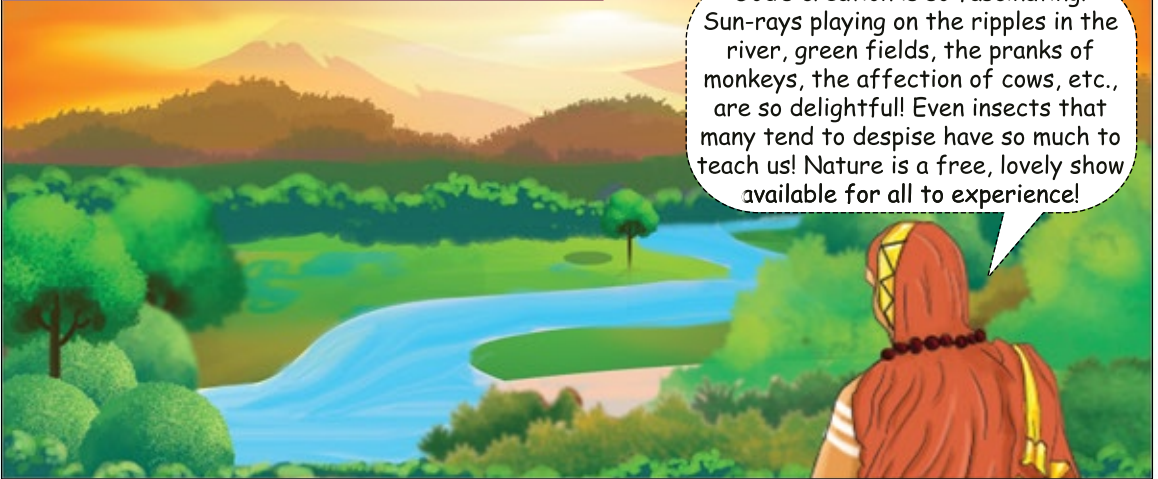
He would mix up all the items of food before eating so that he would not know the taste of any food item.

One night an army of ants invaded his room and left most of his back red and swollen. He did not so much as tell anyone about it.



He never complained or lamented about anything. On the contrary, he was ever cheerful.

From a very young age, he deeply cherished Nature.



God's creation is so fascinating! Sun-rays playing on the ripples in the river, green fields, the pranks of monkeys, the affection of cows, etc., are so delightful! Even insects that many tend to despise have so much to teach us! Nature is a free, lovely show available for all to experience!

He once spotted a wasp sealing a motionless grasshopper into a mud hole, leaving a tiny opening.



There must be larvae inside.

He wanted to study the inhabitants of the hole but had no magnifying glass.

He immediately improvised and created one. He put a drop of rain water in a hole poked into a leaf...



...and used it to study the inhabitants of the hole.



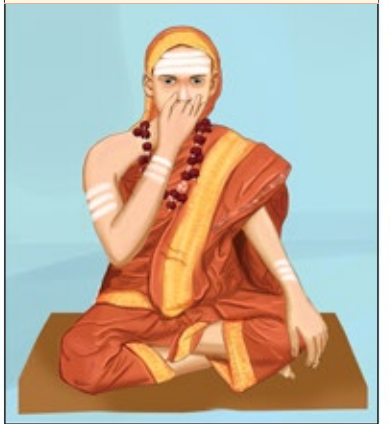
Such interest and ingenuity were the norm with him.

For seven nights from the night of taking Sannyasa, His Holiness had a series of dreams of Lord Shiva.



In the dreams, Shiva taught him Yoga by demonstrating various types of Pranayama, Yogasanas and Yogic Kriyas.

With his natural ability and diligent practice, he quickly mastered these Yogic practices.



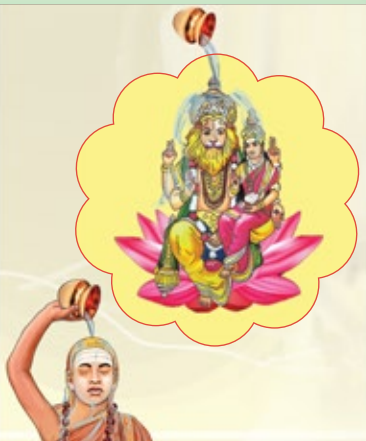
Some weeks later, when the Senior Jagadguru started initiating him into the Narasimha Mantra\*, His Holiness clearly visualized Lord Narasimha in his heart-lotus and mentally offered elaborate worship.



As he repeated the mantra, Narasimha clearly appeared and shone in his heart.



After this experience, he started offering all his thoughts, words and deeds to Narasimha.

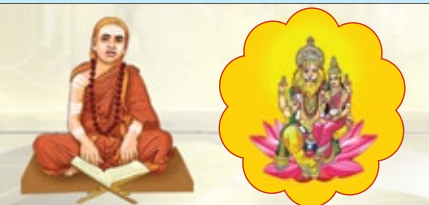


When he bathed, he felt he was doing abhisheka# to Narasimha...

When he ate, he felt he was feeding Narasimha...



When he read he felt he was reading out to Narasimha who was listening from within...



When walking, he felt he was taking Narasimha who was within him, for a stroll...

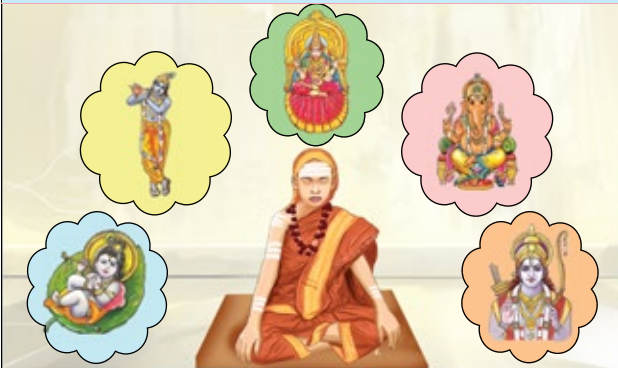
When His Holiness was sixteen years old, the Senior Jagadguru initiated him into the practice of deep meditation on divine forms.



From his very first session of meditation, his mind never wandered. He invariably lost awareness of his body and surroundings, and of the passage of time.



He could meditate with felicity on various forms of God.



He experimented with meditative techniques and became a past master at them.

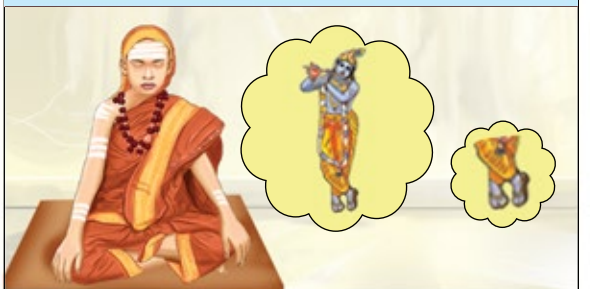


He could adjust the luminosity of the imagined divine form as also the intensity and colour of the background lighting.

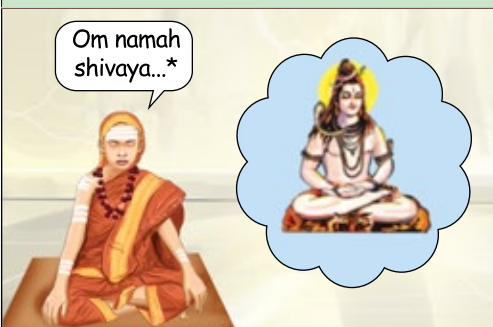
He could visualize the entire form with uniform clarity, though normally when part of an object is focussed upon, the rest of it would be less clear.



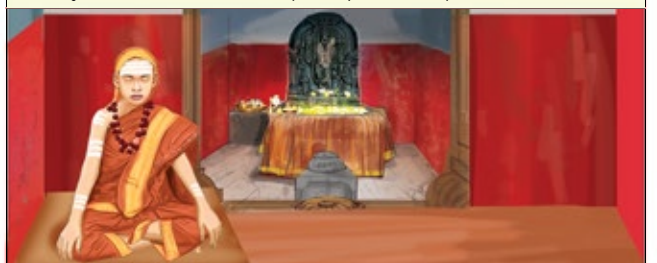
He could also zoom in to a part of the divine form such as the feet, while never forgetting that the part belonged to the specific divinity.



He could peg the intensity of concentration at a lower level if he wished to chant a mantra throughout.



His Holiness used to meditate thrice a day. In the evenings, he meditated at the Kalabhairava# temple atop an adjacent hill. About a year passed by in this manner.



One evening, he started to focus on the form of Goddess Balamba@.

Suddenly his mind locked on to Her Feet. He had an extraordinary experience of seeing Her feet throbbing with life! He beheld the Goddess Herself and not just a visualized form!



This was his first experience of Savikalpa Samadhi\*.

He reached out and touched Her feet with his hands.

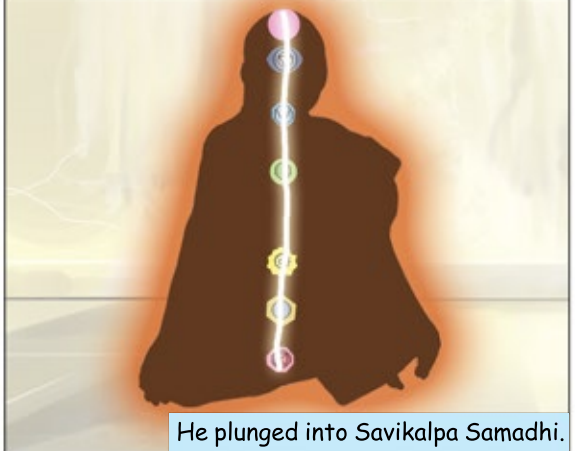


After this experience, he readily started attaining Savikalpa Samadhi on any divine form meditated upon.

After about one and a half hours in that state, he opened his eyes. He could then literally see Balamba in front of him within the temple!



A few months later, he had an experience of Kundalini Yoga#.



He plunged into Savikalpa Samadhi.

One evening, he meditated on Lord Shiva as residing in his heart-lotus. He remained in Savikalpa Samadhi for about an hour and a half.

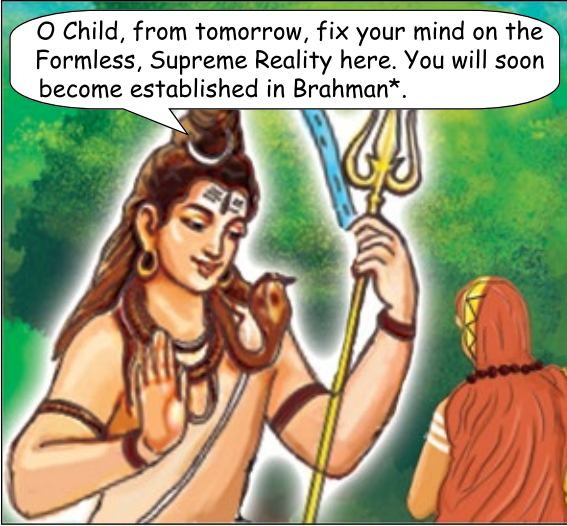


When he opened his eyes the Lord emerged from within and expanded. His Holiness then directly beheld Shiva in front of Him!

O Child, from tomorrow, fix your mind on the Formless, Supreme Reality here. You will soon become established in Brahman\*.



Having blessed him by placing His hand on his head, Shiva disappeared.

His Holiness felt like meditating again, and did so on Shiva as Dakshinamurthy, the primordial Teacher.

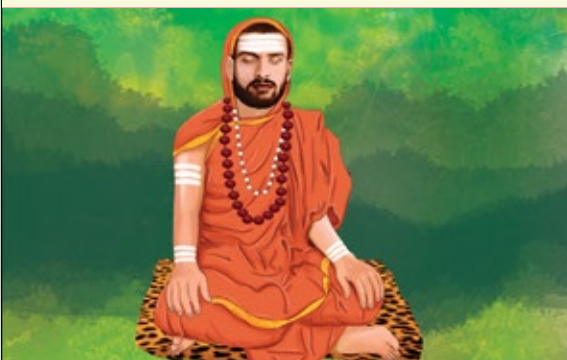


When he opened his eyes after about an hour, he found a big cobra loosely coiled around his neck!



He had meditated on the One who wears the snake as an ornament, and now a snake adorned him!

The next evening, he commenced meditation on the Supreme as devoid of attributes. He attained Nirvikalpa Samadhi#, the acme of Yoga, in just five days!



Over the next two days, he repeatedly attained that highest state of Yoga.

On the evening of the second day, he went into Nirvikalpa Samadhi twice in quick succession. When he opened his eyes, two birds were sitting on his shoulders.



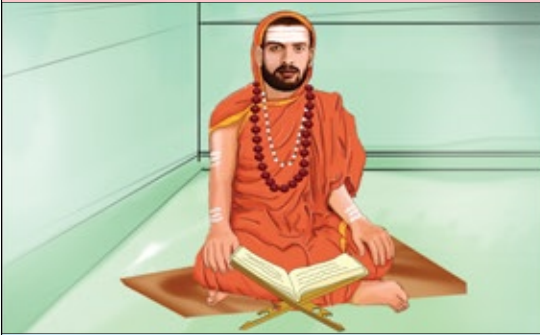
His Holiness had become a Jivanmukta®. The date was 12<sup>th</sup> December, 1935. He was just eighteen.

Though he had transcended the need to do anything, he carried out all his duties to perfection, for the good of the world.



First, he studied diligently and mastered the scriptures, especially the Vedanta, Tarka and Yoga Shastras\*.

He served his Guru with supreme devotion, taking personal care of him especially when the latter was unwell.



For his part, the Senior Jagadguru had such great affection and regard for his disciple, that he even composed verses on him.

Dr. Rajendra Prasad, the President of India, came to Sringeri. The President met both the Jagadgurus at Goddess Sharadamba's# temple.



The President was all admiration for His Holiness.

In September 1954, the Senior Jagadguru shed his mortal body, and His Holiness duly took over as the 35th pontiff of the Peetham.



He envisioned and then systematically carried to fruition, developmental work in a variety of spheres to benefit people and society at large.



Being a die-hard conservationist, he carried out the afforestation of several hills around Sringeri, thereby enriching the ecosystem of that part of the Western Ghats.

He built and consecrated many a temple across India and revived temple worship in even remote villages.



He built new guest houses at Sringeri for visiting pilgrims, as also kalyana mandapas\* and dharmashalas# in various places in the country.



Sringeri's first coconut groves came up due to his efforts. He also introduced several agricultural innovations.

He set up Pathashalas@ at various places to further Vedic learning. He always took personal interest in the well-being and studies of the students.



He started the first Girls' School at Sringeri and the Jnanodaya School at Bengaluru. He was patron of the Sree Sankara College, Kalady, and also set up libraries and research centres.

Earlier, there was no medical facility available for the people of Sringeri and the neighbouring rural areas. His Holiness set right this lacuna by establishing the multi-speciality Sharada Dhanvantari Charitable Hospital at Sringeri in the early 1980s.



Though Sringeri was a remote place, he procured state-of-the-art medical and research equipment for the hospital and appointed the best doctors to look after the various departments.

No wastage, big or small, was acceptable to him. Once when on a visit to a place, he noticed that water from an overhead tank was often overflowing and thus being wasted.



He had a coconut sapling planted at the spot to put the excess water to good use.



His Holiness toured India thrice over a period of three decades. From village to village he went, touching the lives of millions in myriads of ways.



In some places he was accomodated in palaces...



...while in some others, his hosts could manage to provide only very meagre facilities. Such factors, however, never mattered to him.



He was the first Sringeri Jagadguru in over a hundred years to grace the cities of Chennai as also Hyderabad, and the first ever to visit Mumbai, Delhi and Kolkata.



In 1967, he became the first Jagadguru Shankaracharya after Adi Shankaracharya to visit Nepal, and was welcomed with great respect and affection.

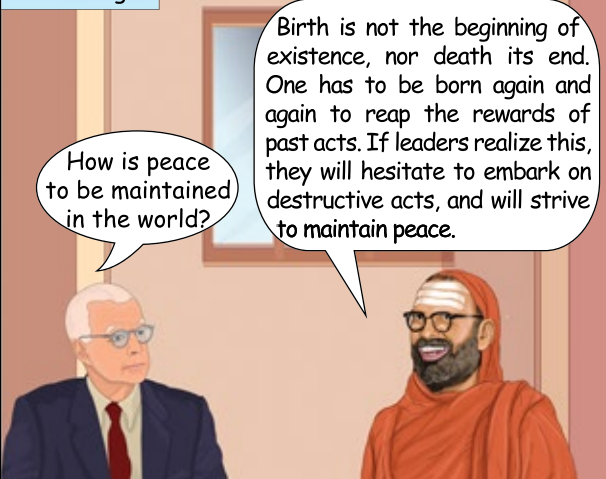


As a rare recognition, the Government of Nepal inscribed a large plaque in the precincts of the Pashupathinath Temple, to commemorate this landmark visit of His Holiness.

When he went on his maiden visit to Varanasi in 1967, he expounded on the scriptures to an audience of scholars celebrated as the most learned in the land. The scholars, to whom he was a stranger when he arrived, were left spellbound at his deep erudition and sheer intellectual brilliance.



The U.S. Ambassador to India, Mr. Elsworth Bunker, came to meet His Holiness in 1960 and asked him several questions regarding the problems of the modern age.

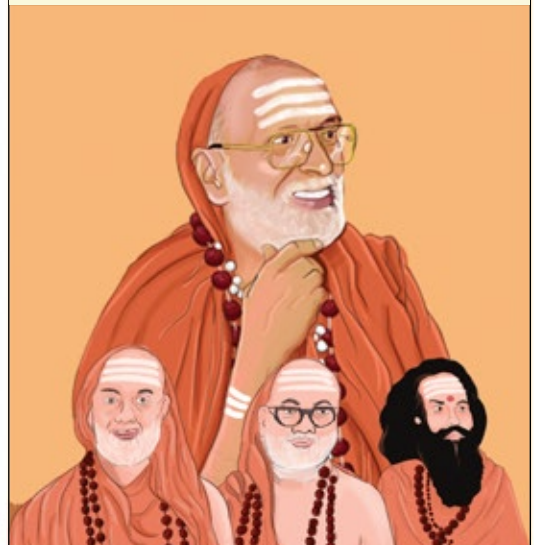


How is peace to be maintained in the world?

Birth is not the beginning of existence, nor death its end. One has to be born again and again to reap the rewards of past acts. If leaders realize this, they will hesitate to embark on destructive acts, and will strive to maintain peace.

Mr. Bunker left feeling not only blessed but also deeply impressed by His Holiness's practical solutions that hit straight at the root of problems.

His Holiness organized a historic summit meeting of the Jagadgurus of the four Amnaya Peethams\*, the first since the time of Adi Shankaracharya. The Jagadgurus released a joint message for world peace.

Heads of Government, ministers, kings and various other dignitaries held His Holiness in the highest respect and sought his blessings on several occasions.



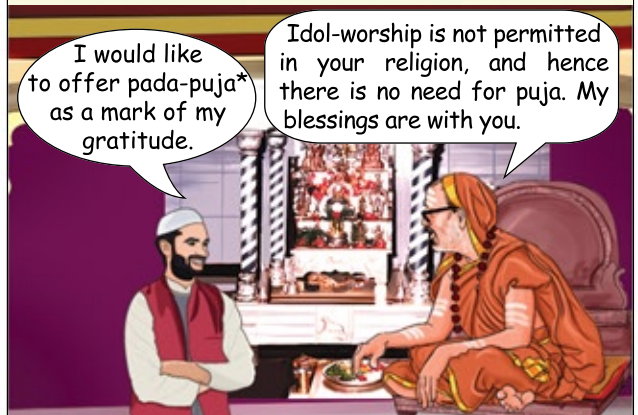
Economic status, caste, creed, religion and the like did not matter to His Holiness. People flocked to see him wherever he went. They sought his advice and blessings to tide over their difficulties, and also shared their joys with him.



Once, a Muslim gentleman who was longing for progeny came to seek his blessings. Before the man could even say anything...



Soon the man was blessed with a son. He went back to Sringeri and joyously gave the news to His Holiness.



His Holiness always held that people should sincerely adhere to the tenets of their own religion.

Once, a lame man was coming for darshan\* amidst the teeming crowd. The man was trying hard but was unable to keep abreast with the others.



His Holiness spotted him from afar.



He got up immediately, rushed down the stairs to the man, made tender enquiries and blessed him.



Disabled people always merited his special attention.

On a highway, he once saw a partially overturned car. Many motorists were passing by without even a second look. He asked for his vehicle to be stopped, and rushed to the car.



He found an accident victim inside, unconscious but alive. He immediately sent a Math vehicle to bring an ambulance from the nearest town.

He discerned that the car needed to be set upright in order to extricate the man, and that it could be done without harming him. He laboured, along with the others, to do the needful.

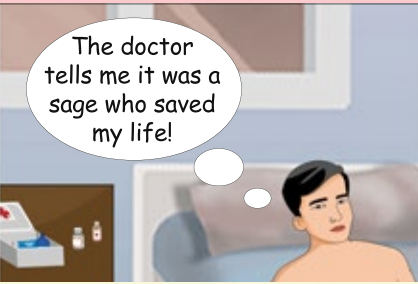


Cautious inspection revealed to him that the man could be safely extricated without waiting for paramedics. He got him out carefully.

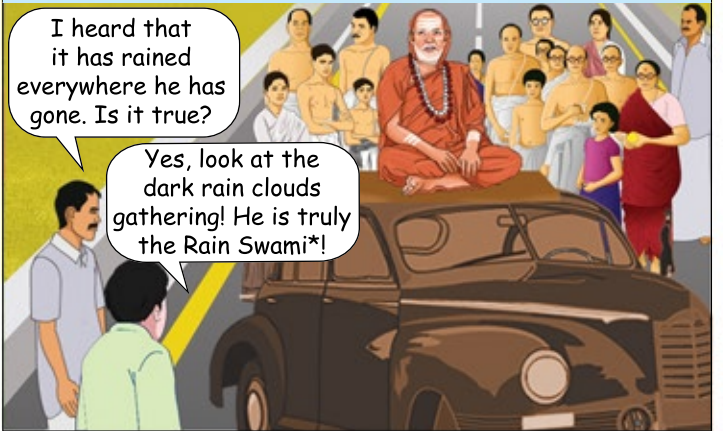
He then sent the man in a spacious vehicle in the direction from which the ambulance was expected.

The swift yet careful actions of His Holiness ensured that the accident victim got medical aid at the earliest. The man survived and recovered.

An area was reeling under prolonged drought. His Holiness extensively toured the region at that time, and people noticed a pattern...

Yes, look at the dark rain clouds gathering! He is truly the Rain Swami\*!

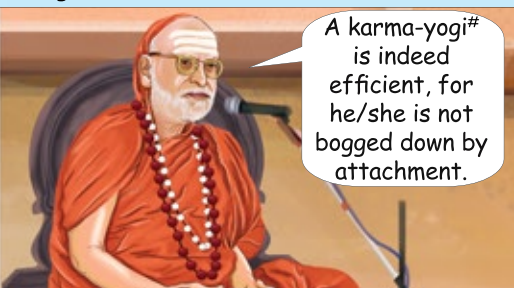
Once at Bengaluru, a function had been organized in a large open space in the Math complex. Much to the chagrin of the officials and the large crowd that had congregated, dark rain clouds gathered and very heavy showers were imminent. Many people in the crowd noticed His Holiness looking up at the sky with folded hands. In moments...



Hey look! The clouds are rapidly marching away!

Wow! What we have been hearing about him as the "Rain Swami" is really true!

Traditional, scripture-based spiritual practice was earlier considered to be only for the spiritually evolved. But through discourses that he delivered by the thousands, His Holiness brought it within reach of the common man.



A karma-yogi# is indeed efficient, for he/she is not bogged down by attachment.

Fluent in Kannada, Telugu, Tamil and Hindi, he could directly communicate with every audience across the country.

It was the early 1970s and His Holiness was set to deliver a benedictory discourse at a venue...

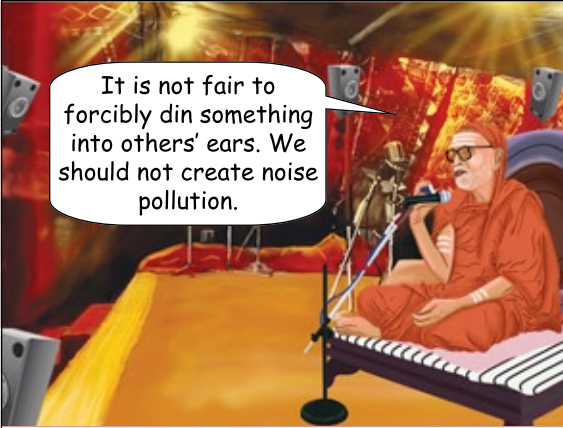


Hmmm. They have set up loudspeakers by the road too.

Observing that the loudspeakers outside were easy to decouple, he asked the organizers to disconnect them.

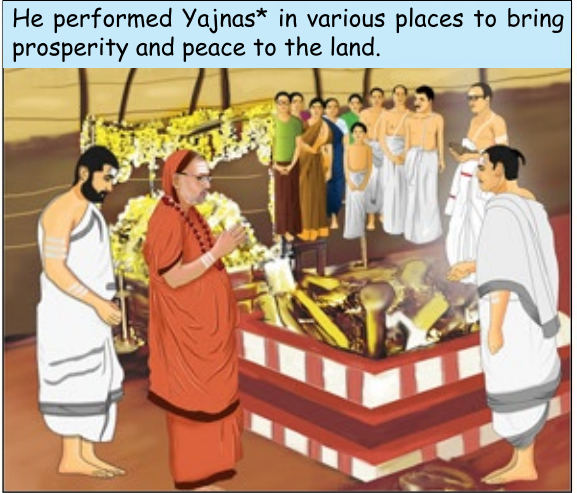

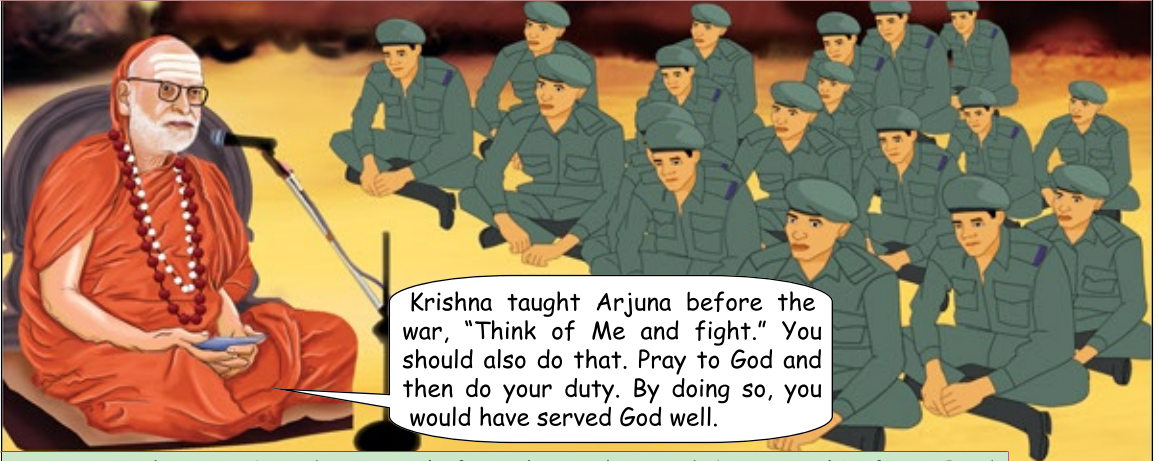
It is not fair to forcibly din something into others' ears. We should not create noise pollution.

He performed Yajnas\* in various places to bring prosperity and peace to the land.

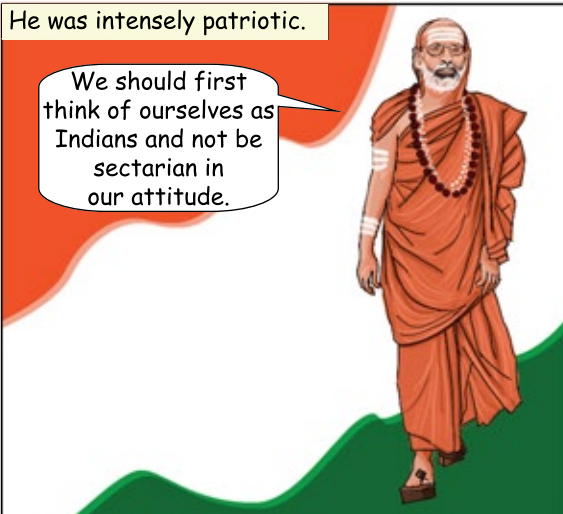
During his tours across India, he was invited to address India's armed forces on several occasions.

At war time, he contributed generously from the Math to India's National Defence Fund.

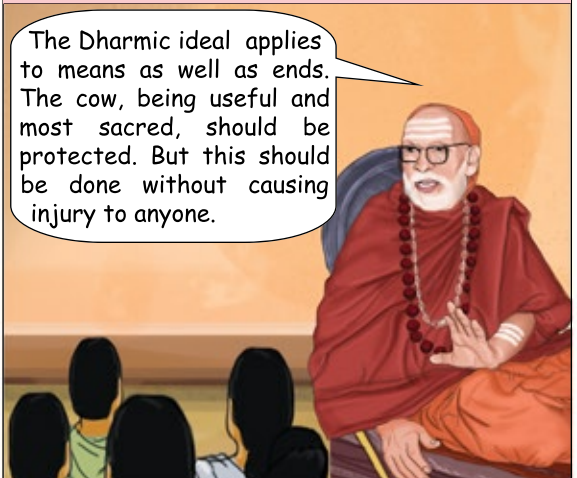
He was intensely patriotic.

He used to be moved to tears while reading stories of India's freedom-fighters and martyrs.

He was a staunch adherent of Ahimsa and abhorred violence. When the agitation against cow slaughter took a violent turn in the country...



The Dharmic ideal applies to means as well as ends. The cow, being useful and most sacred, should be protected. But this should be done without causing injury to anyone.

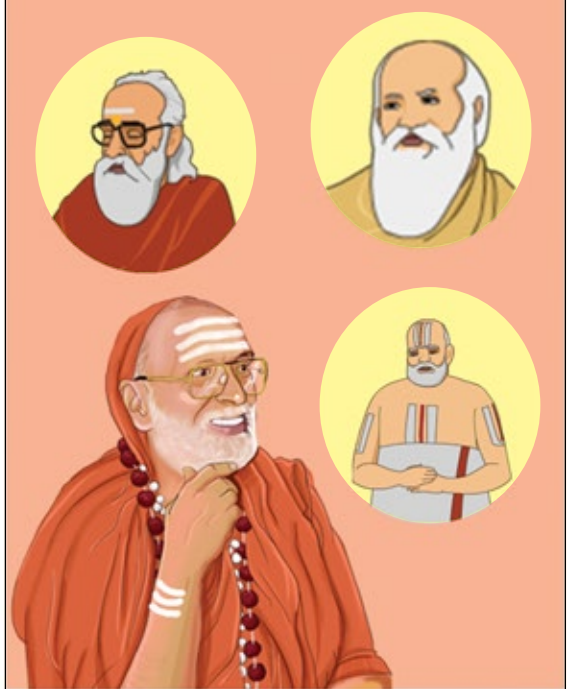
He was never one to just preach. He practiced to a tee. He maintained a *Goshala*\* at Sringeri with almost a hundred cows that he looked after with tender care.



He evinced deep interest not only in traditional branches of learning but also in a wide variety of subjects such as agriculture, horticulture, engineering, photography and electronics.



Heads of diverse religious organizations had great regard and affection for His Holiness and sought his advice and blessings on many occasions.



A true liberal, he appreciated people for who they were and did not expect them to toe his line. His universal affection drew many to him.



G. D. Naidu, the genius inventor and avowed non-believer, held His Holiness in the highest respect and even named his technical training institute and a hall he built, after him.

Full of life, he grabbed every opportunity to do something he loved - swimming. No river or ocean was given a miss by this expert swimmer!

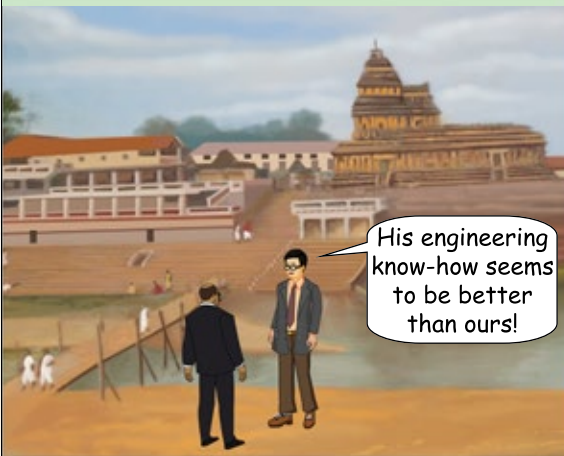


He was thorough with every task he undertook. He had plans to build a bridge across River Tunga at Sringeri, and invited a multinational construction company for discussions.

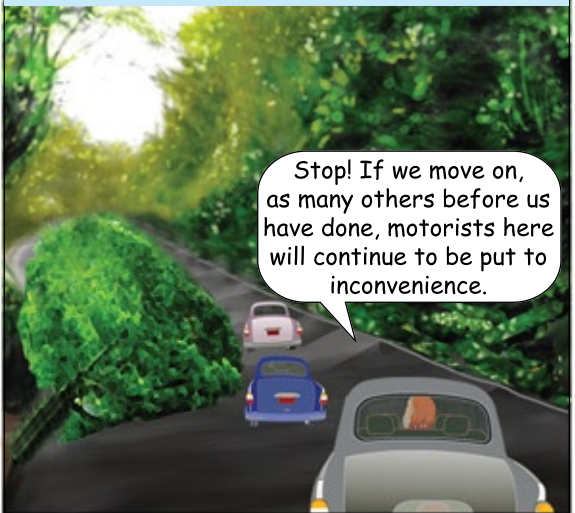


While pulling out an album he had prepared with photos and specifications of major bridges of the world, he discussed what would be the ideal design for a bridge at Sringeri.

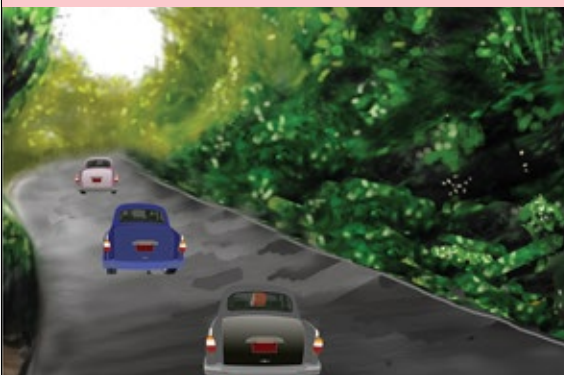
His knowledge pleasantly surprised the high-level delegation. In fact, as the officials left...



His Holiness's sense of responsible citizenship came to the fore many a time. Once a tree had fallen across the road and commuters had to veer around it. As his car crossed the place...

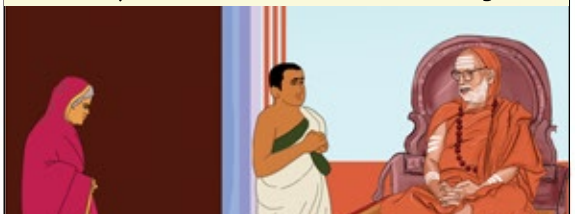


Directed and also assisted by him, the Math staff soon cleared up the obstruction.

His Holiness never hesitated to make personal adjustments just for others' convenience. Once an old lady from North India came to Sringeri.

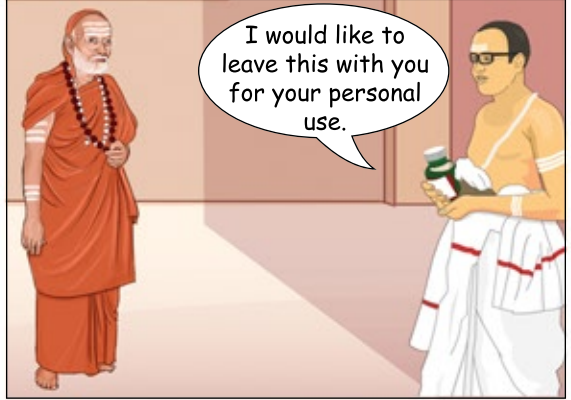


She had saved up for a long time to make the trip and had come all the way solely for his darshan. She was to stay only for two days.

His Holiness's compassion extended to all beings. A devotee once brought a rare herbal preparation that he had found to be remarkably effective in healing open wounds.



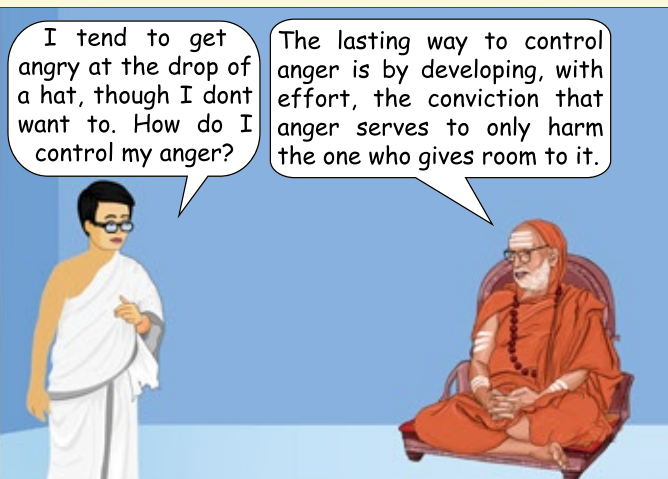
A few days later, His Holiness came across a stray dog lying by the wayside, whimpering in pain. The dog was very badly injured. Without a moment's hesitation...



He made sure the wound was cleaned and the application of the ointment was kept up for a few days. The wound healed rather fast and the dog returned to normalcy very soon.

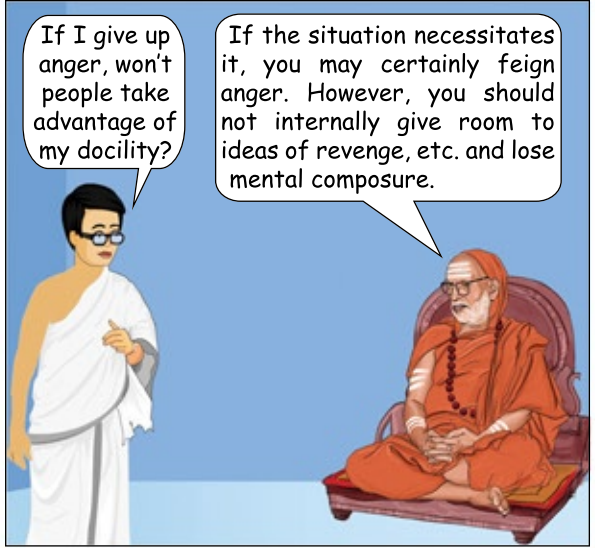
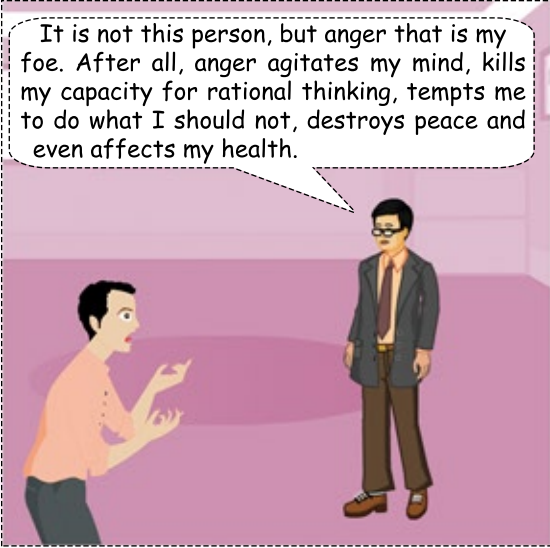


A devotee once came to His Holiness with a question, and an interesting conversation ensued.



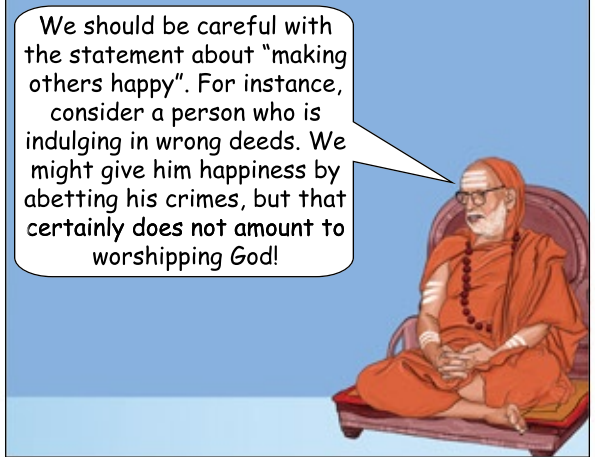
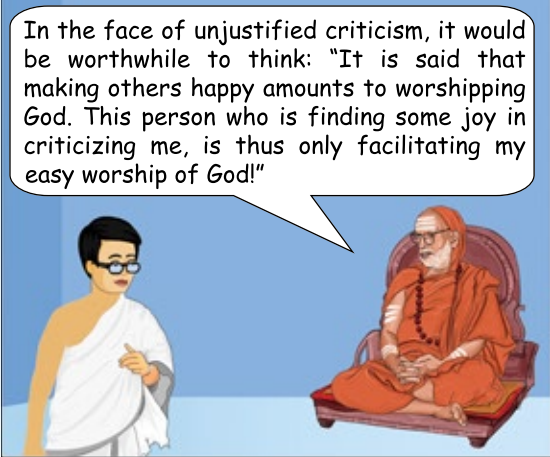
"For example, suppose that someone is chiding you, and your anger gets kindled. You could then think..."





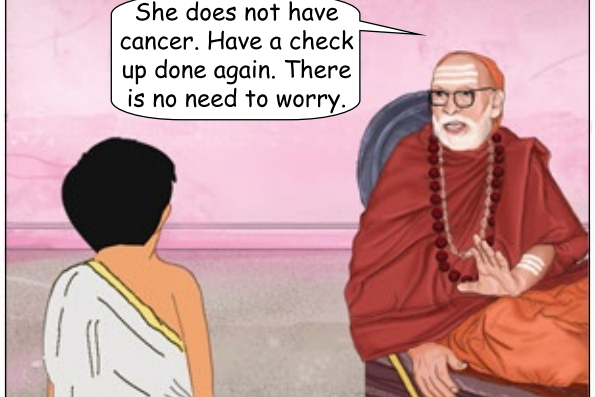
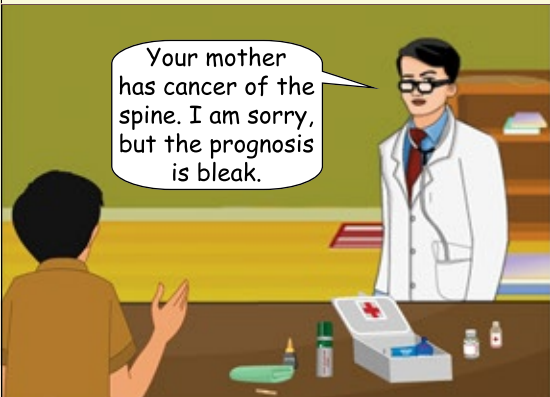
His Holiness then shared an invaluable spiritual tip about dealing with people.

Numerous were the instances in which His Holiness's grace was sufficient for people to overcome even major problems. A devotee's mother was taken ill and after clinical tests...

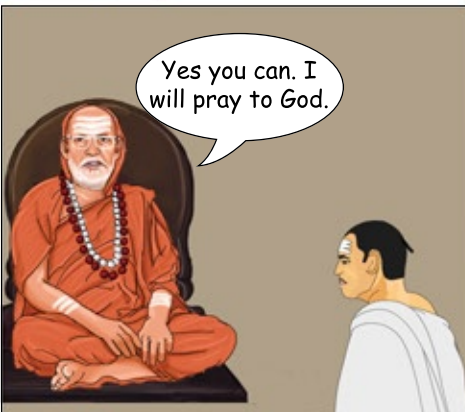
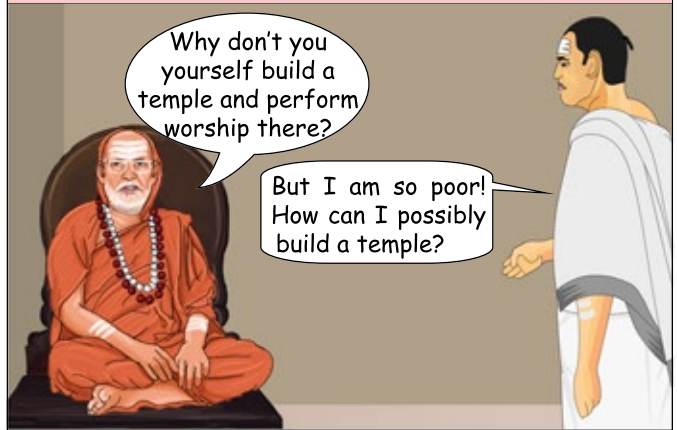
At his wits' end, the devotee rushed to His Holiness who was camping in a nearby town, and apprised him of the matter.

A priest at a temple had to suddenly quit his job and was unable to find another one. Consequently his financial position became grave. He went to His Holiness and presented his problems.



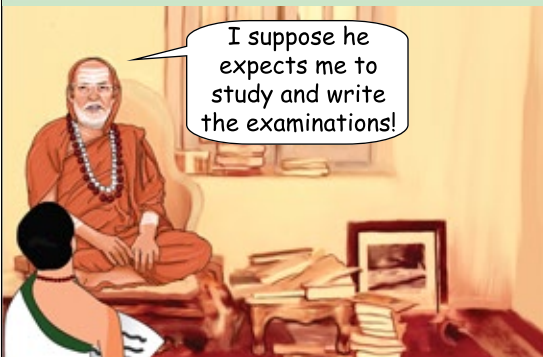
With His Holiness's grace acting as a catalyst, voluntary contributions poured in from unexpected quarters. And much to the priest's amazement, the temple became a reality very soon.

There were several other occasions in which His Holiness chose to prescribe simple expiatory rites or mantras for people to tide over difficulties. One day a distraught devotee came to him.

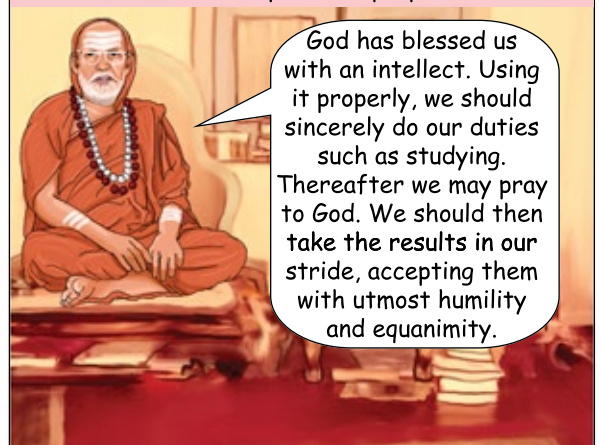


The lad sincerely followed the instruction. To the surprise of his doctors, his condition gradually improved.

On witnessing such fine aesthetics and divine manner of performing worship, the crowd spontaneously erupted into applause though it was not the norm to do so.

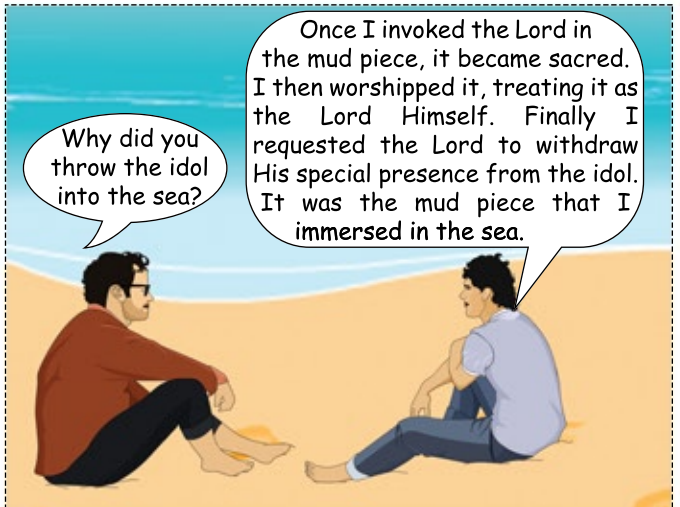
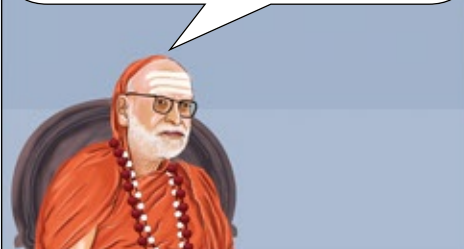
Once, when the naivedya# items were duly brought by the attendant during the puja...

Ha! How is it possible for a mere piece of mud to undergo such transformations and how can you possibly effect them?

Well, we make an ordinary man a minister, vest in him special authority, and then make him ordinary again. Likewise, a devotee's requests are sufficient for the Lord to sanctify even a mere mud idol and later withdraw Himself from it.

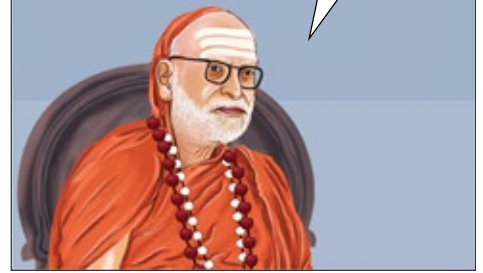


Why do you make offerings during the worship when the idol does not accept any of them?

When a picture can represent even a mortal, why can't an idol represent God? A devotee sees in the idol not mud but the living presence of God. He makes offerings to God with great affection, and treats them as accepted by God.



Wherever there is a drop in pressure, air rushes in. Likewise, God who is everywhere, specially occupies idols where He is worshipped. Though He does not require anything from us, whatever we offer with devotion, He accepts.



An interesting episode transpired when a certain young lawyer happened to visit Sringeri. He went up to a disciple there.

On seeing His Holiness, the lawyer abruptly prostrated and remained so for quite some time. Finally...

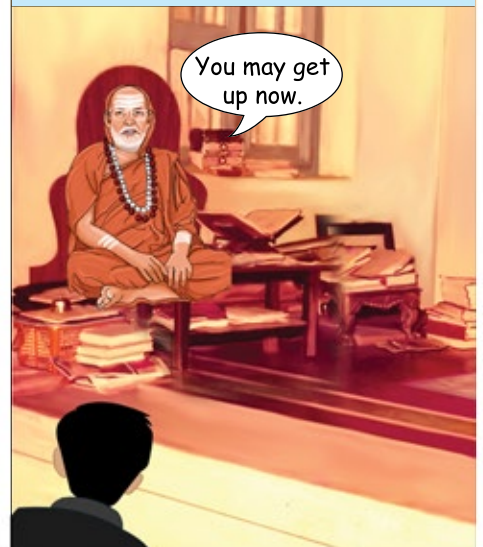
I came here for sightseeing. I am an atheist but am curious to see what the head of this Math is like. Can I see him? However, I will not prostrate before him.

His Holiness will be giving darshan in a few minutes. Anybody can go in. You can decide for yourself whether you want to go or not.



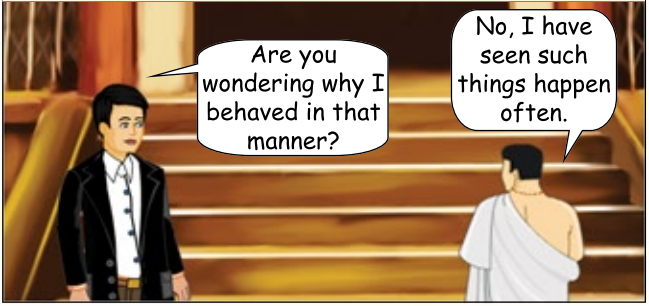
Soon the door was opened and the lawyer followed a group of devotees into the room.

After coming out, the lawyer spotted the disciple he had conversed with earlier.

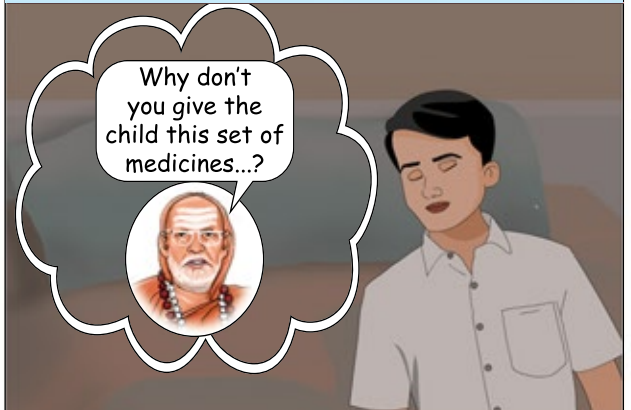


Not only people who came to him, but sometimes even strangers became recipients of His Holiness's grace. Once, a child was brought in a critical condition to a much sought-after doctor.

That night the doctor had a dream in which a monk unknown to him appeared...

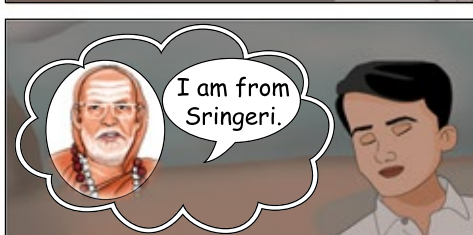
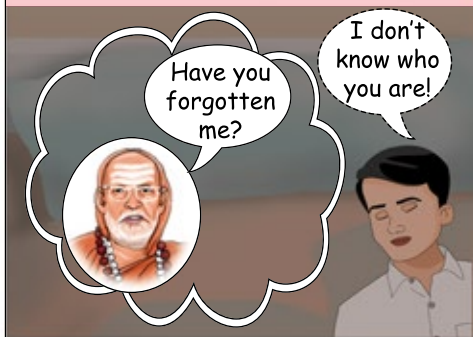


When the doctor woke up, he felt that the combination of medicines suggested in the dream may indeed help the child. He proceeded to the hospital and administered the drugs.

His Holiness accorded very high priority to spiritual aspirants. Once a devout foreigner came to Sringeri, hoping to get some clarifications in Vedanta.

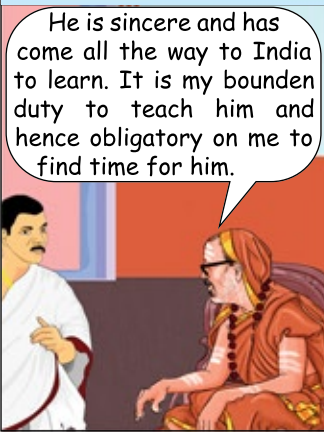


Preparations were on for the Shishya Sweekara\* ceremony and it was next to impossible for His Holiness to spare time for him. However, he did.



With an interpreter for help, His Holiness cleared every one of the foreigner's doubts.

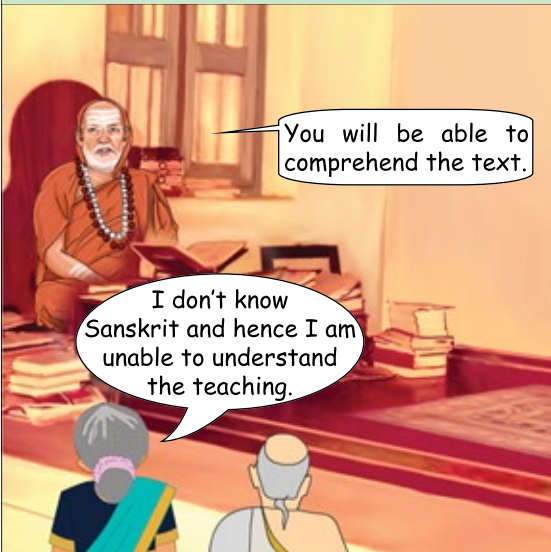
On being asked about his sparing so much time, His Holiness said...



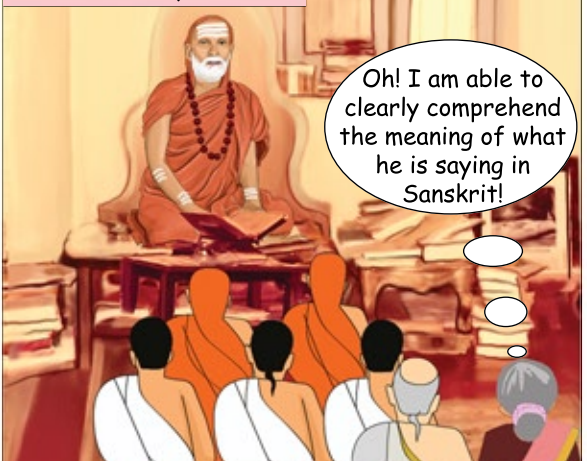

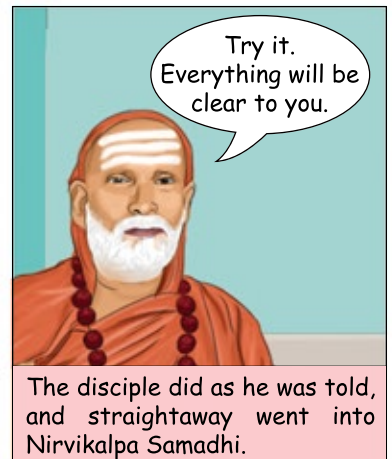
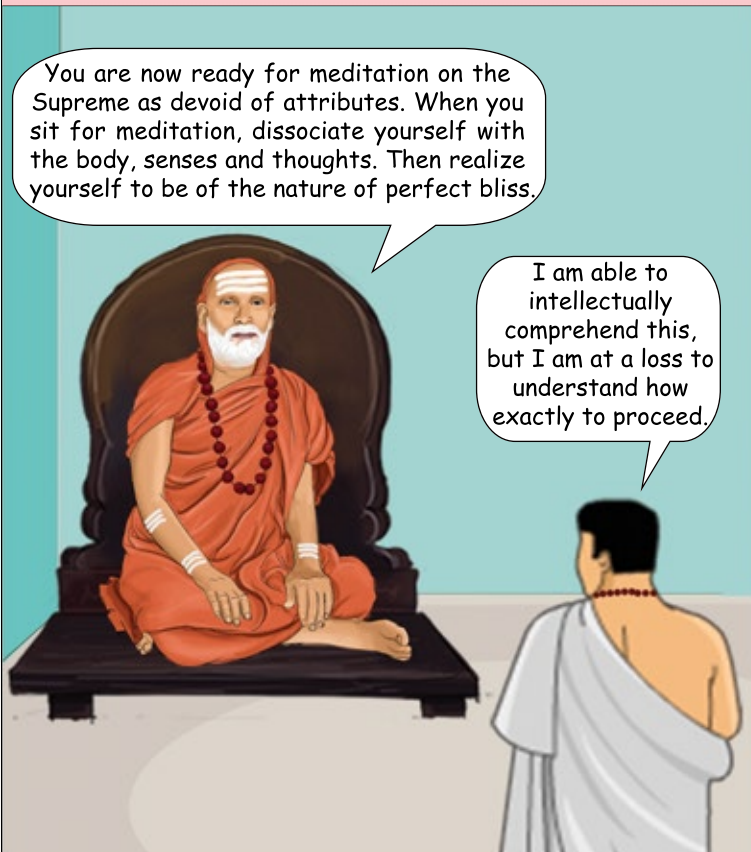
The boy wrote to His Holiness describing the dream and seeking his guidance regarding the mantra.

On receiving the letter, His Holiness gave instructions for an official reply from the Math to be sent to the boy...

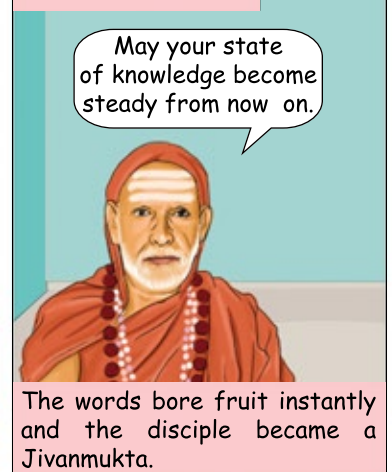

His Holiness chose Sitarama Anjaneyulu, a brilliant young boy established in Brahmacharya\* and devoted to God, as his successor to the Peetham.

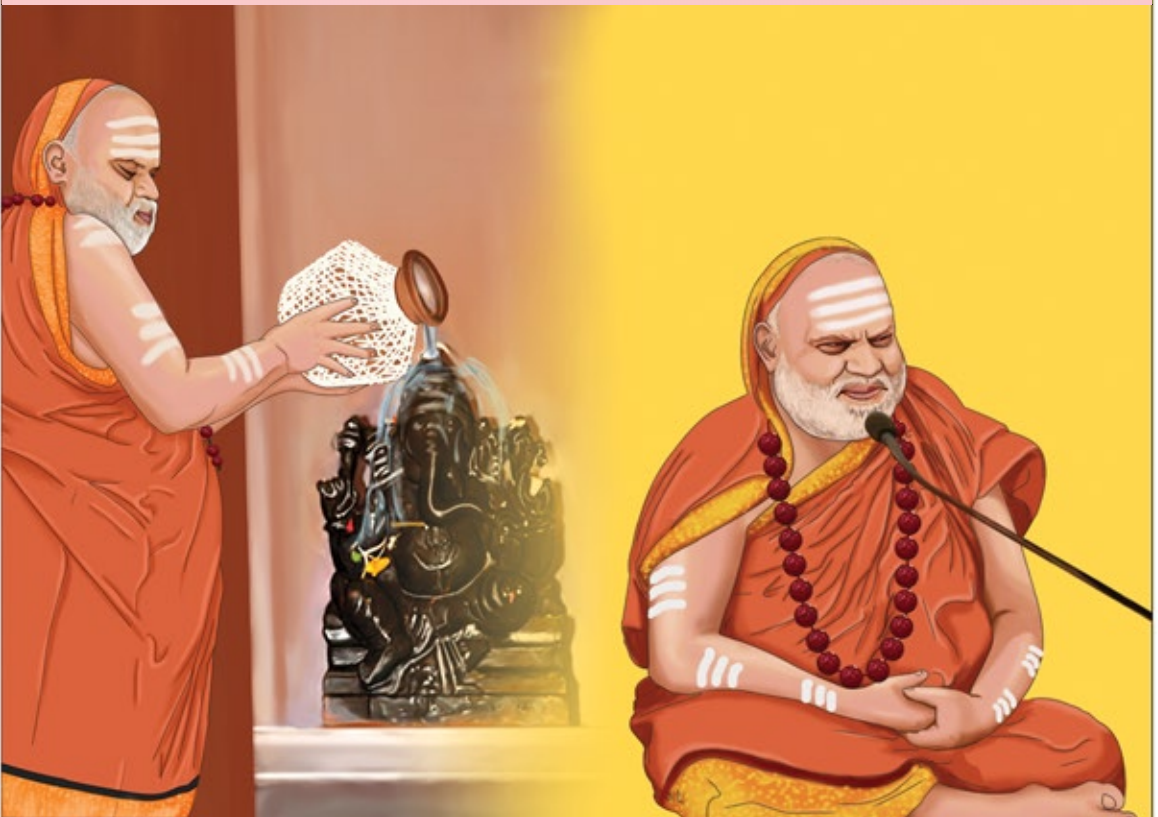

The young Jagadguru practiced great austerity and learnt the scriptures from His Holiness. He accompanied his Guru on many of his tours and was greatly devoted to him.



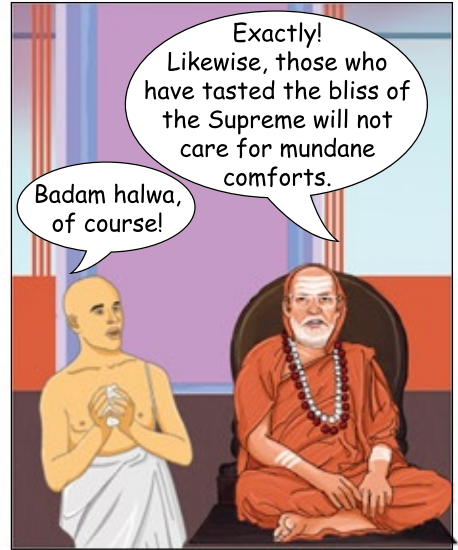
He has, over the years, carried on his Guru's work of upholding and spreading Sanatana Dharma throughout India, in order to secure the true and lasting well-being of her people.



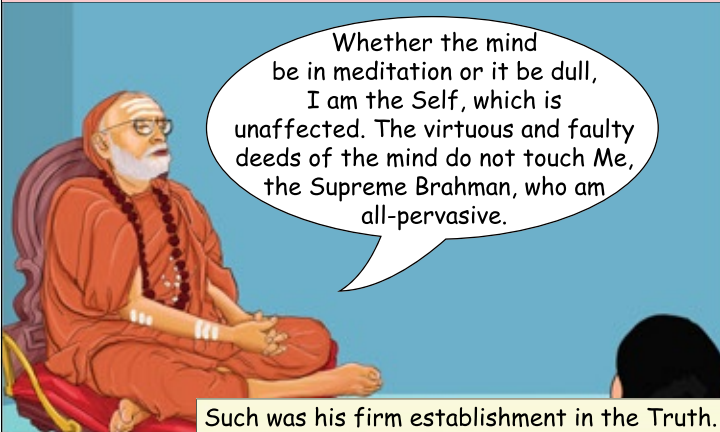

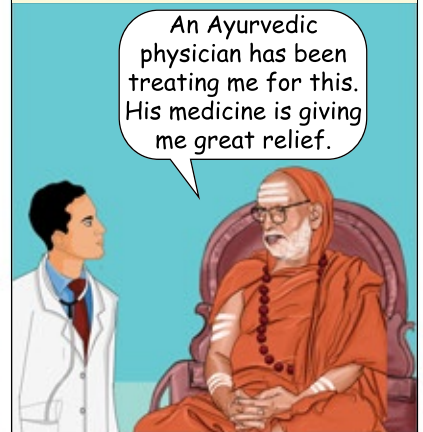
Once, on observing how His Holiness toiled every day from early morning to late at night even at an advanced age, a devotee couldn't help asking him...



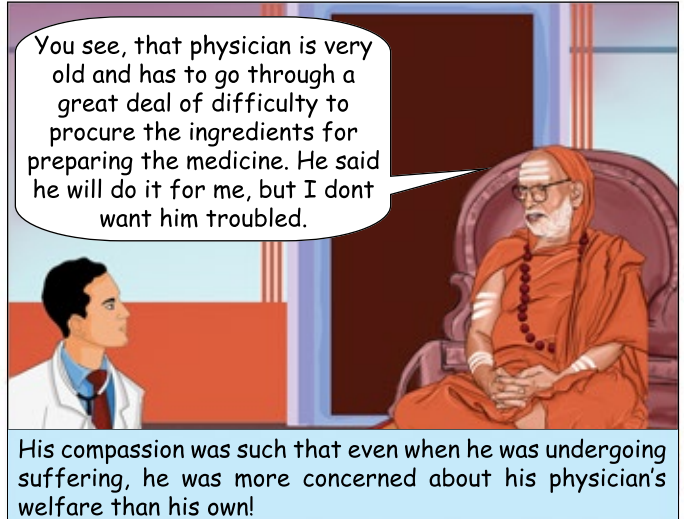

He entered the room noiselessly. He found His Holiness awake and in much pain, and softly chanting the Lord's name. On seeing the attendant...

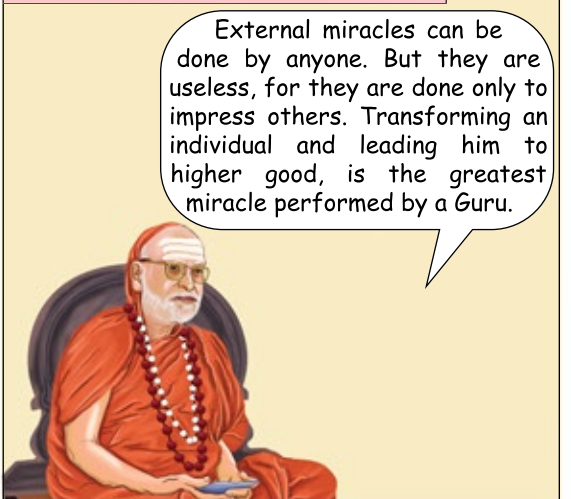


Even in pain, he was only concerned about others' comfort. As for himself, he just let the body run its course.
